# CRITERIA FOR THE "TOP BIGGEST SKI RESORTS IN 10 EUROPEAN COUNTRIES" RANKINGS


- 1. The ranking includes the largest ski resorts, in terms of the length of ski runs counted in kilometers. The results of the ranking have been compiled taking into account the following principles:
- a. The runs in the resort are connected by a network of ski lifts and do not require travel by bus or car.
- b. Only the groomed ski runs marked as blue, red and black are taken into account. Ski touring and freeride routes are not included.
- c. If the length of the ski runs in the resorts is comparable, the parameter of elevation, i.e. the difference in height between the highest and the lowest point on the runs in the resort, is also taken into account. The resort with the higher elevation has a higher ranking.
- d. The resort was open (most runs open) for more than 30 days in the 2022/23 ski season.
- e. If the resort is located on the border of two countries:
- The entire resort is included in the TOP 10 Europe ranking;
- Only the part of a resort that is located in a particular country is included in the TOP 10 Country ranking;
- Only the part of a resort that is located in a particular region is included in the TOP 10 Region ranking.
- f. In the case of resorts situated on the border of two regions, only the part of a resort that is located in a region (the region where the majority of the resort is situated) is taken into account.
- g. Each of the ten countries was divided into Ski Regions with the highest number of ski resorts and ski runs. If a country has a small area or less than 3 ski regions meeting the minimum criteria, then the whole country is regarded as one Ski Region, e.g. Slovenia, or is combined with a neighboring country like Andorra, added as an Andorra Ski Region of Spain.
- 2. The compilation covers 10 European countries: **Austria, Czech Republic, France, Germany, Italy, Poland, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Switzerland.**
- 3. TOP 10 BIGGEST SKI RESORTS IN EUROPE ranking a list of the ten largest ski resorts in terms of the number of kilometers of ski runs in Europe.

- 4. TOP 10 BIGGEST SKI RESORTS IN ONE COUNTRY ranking a list of the ten biggest ski resorts in terms of the number of kilometers of ski runs in each of the 10 countries separately:

# Les 3 Vallées ski resort is the largest in Europe — and the world!

Stretching 20 kilometers in a straight line between Courchevel and Orelle, this ski area features a remarkable 600-kilometer network of ski slopes, covering over 1,500 hectares. With a ski season that lasts 150 days, or five months, Les 3 Vallées offers endless opportunities for skiing.



The long ski season is made possible by a combination of several factors. The high-altitude location and favorable topography of the resort play a significant role, with ski areas ranging from 1,800 to 3,230 meters in elevation. Impressively, 85% of the ski runs are located at altitudes above 1,800 meters. Additionally, Les 3 Vallées has 2,700 snow cannons positioned throughout the area, ensuring artificial snow coverage when needed. Another advantage is the ski connections between valleys that are situated on mountain ridges, rather than valley floors, at altitudes over 2,000 meters. This unique layout helps maintain exceptional snow quality for skiers traveling between resorts. Every night, 70 snow groomers work to prepare the slopes, ensuring top-notch conditions for the next day.

Thanks to its vast size, Les 3 Vallées allows you to choose an area with the best weather conditions. When fog or snow descends, you can seek shelter in the lower parts of the mountains, or you can head to the peaks and glaciers to ski above the clouds. During the late season, the northern slopes offer better snow quality, while the southern slopes provide warmth on the coldest winter days. The resort also boasts an ideal mix of slopes, with 50% dedicated to beginners and 50% reserved for more advanced skiers.



# One of the standout features of Les 3 Vallées is the ability to connect different valleys without using public transportation.

Key ski connections include La Saulire Summit (2,738 m) between Courchevel and Méribel, Col de La Loze (2,304 m) between Courchevel and Méribel, Tougnète Summit (2,434 m) between Méribel and Les Menuires, Roc de Fer (2,290 m) between Méribel and Saint-Martin-de-Belleville, Mont de la Chambre (2,850 m) in Les Menuires, and Cime Caron (3,200 m) in Val Thorens.

# Off-piste skiing is another exciting option in Les 3 Vallées.


French ESF ski school instructors and mountain guides can lead you safely through wild routes such as the classic Gebroulaz, Le Borgne, Geffrian, and Lac du Lou routes.

The diverse landscapes and atmospheres in Les 3 Vallées are unparalleled. Start your day with a luxurious experience in Courchevel, then head to Courchevel-Moriond, Méribel Altiport, or Courchevel-La Tania. For a wilder adventure, ski the slopes of Mont Vallon, or enjoy the village charm of Saint-Martin-de-Belleville. You can also explore the rocky terrain of Orelle or join in the fun at La Folie Douce in Val Thorens.

The 3 Vallées ski pass opens the door to a range of exciting activities. Thrill-seekers can tackle the legendary Grand Couloir in Courchevel or three off-piste Liberty Ride safe zones in Les Menuires. Steep slope lovers will be challenged by the Vertical Xperience Méribel, featuring a 37° gully. Freestyle enthusiasts can enjoy VT Park in Val Thorens, Bump'N'Jump in Méribel, or the more accessible Family Park in Courchevel. Families with young children will find plenty of fun areas, such as Yeti Park and Open Park in Méribel Mottaret, Piste des Animaux and Piste des Inuits in Méribel, Friendly Natural Park in Les Menuires, and Western Ski Park and Fun Park in Courchevel.

Les 3 Vallées offers extraordinary experiences both on and off the slopes, from ice skating in Courchevel and Méribel, tobogganing throughout the resort, ice driving in Val Thorens, and zip lining in Orelle and Val Thorens. Whether you're looking for budget-friendly accommodations in youth hostels and apartments or luxury in chalets and five-star hotels, Les 3 Vallées has it all. Dining options are equally diverse, ranging from casual snack bars to Michelin-starred restaurants.


